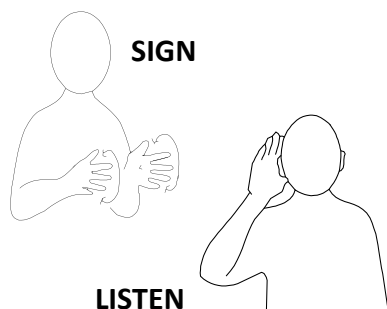


Makaton® of the week

Excitement at Woodhall Air Field

Our C&G Conservation group returned as Wildlife Trust volunteers where we helped to preserve a reed bed by cutting down some trees that if left would return the reed bed to woodland, which would prevent it doing its job of filtering the water that enters the lake. All the group are developing independent work skills and over the weeks have become more confident in handling the tools and working with each other as a team.



Warden Kevin showed us a WW2 bomb that had been dumped on the airfield by a German bomber being chased by a pair spitfires, and later discovered by a rather surprised digger driver. This added an interesting day where we had been lucky enough to have a fly by from Woodhall Spa's resident Dakota and saw a Russet Fox hunting where we were working.

Are you Entitled?

Research shows that pupils are more likely to concentrate in lessons if they have eaten a nutritionally balanced meal at lunchtime.

In order to qualify for free school meals you must be in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit* and have an annual household income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190 (as at April 2012)
- Universal Credit

Twice a year we send out a form to parents and the information from this is used to check if you are eligible. Doing this could save you approx. £450 spent on packed lunches each year and also release extra funds for school.

Walk for Cancer

Pupils from across St Lawrence took part in The Wonderful Winter Walk in aid of children's cancer research for World Cancer Day 2018.



The children walked from School to 50 Acre and back (approx. 3 miles) last Friday and they raised £37.70.
