

Teen Life – Being an autistic teenager

A 6 session program for parents with an autistic teenager aged 10 -16 (Teenager slightly older? Interested in course? Contact us to discuss)

Fridays 9.30-12pm at The Pavillion in Louth

8th, 15th, 22nd, 29th March, 5th and 26th April

Teen Life is a programme that aims to empower parents and support professionals to understand more about how autism is experienced by autistic teenagers. Teen Life is designed to meet the needs of those who have very little previous autism knowledge as well as those who already have a good understanding.

One of the key principles of the programme is autistic perspectives, with autistic and neurotypical (non-autistic) people involved in the content development and review. Throughout the programme, we use a variety of resources from autistic people to try and provide valuable insight into being on the spectrum.

Other topics include self-esteem, spending time with other people, stress and anxiety, understanding your diagnosis, intense interests and puberty.

All parent program books and refreshments are provided. We ask for a voluntary one off donation of £10 to support the running of the course.
